1. Development is pushing env limits



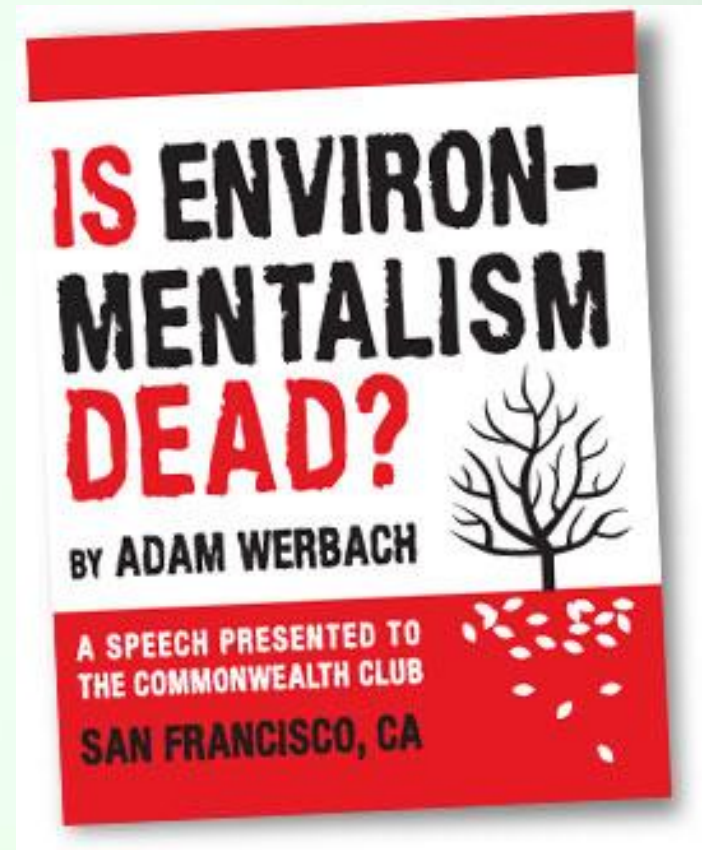

2. But Env and Dev are *separate* worlds

ENVIRONMENT is

- Uncertain
- Unpredictable
- Unvalued
- Unpriced
- Untraded
- Unowned
- Unscrutinised
- 'Un'visible

DEVELOPMENT aims at \$/day, growth, budget support, governance change etc – uninformed by env roles and risks



3. Can env 'fit' into a dev framework?

Development involves:

1. **Assets** and their productivity/person increase; unique assets (global public goods) protected
2. **People empowered** to access assets – and to invest in, manage, trade, and benefit from them
3. **Risks** to assets and to people are reduced
4. **Holistic approach** to many issues over **long term**

IIED has been:

- ***Demonstrating how env is key to each of these four components***
- ***Examining cases of joint policy/investment***
- ***Exploring what env and dev institutions institutions/decisions did***

4. What *has* linked env and dev worlds?

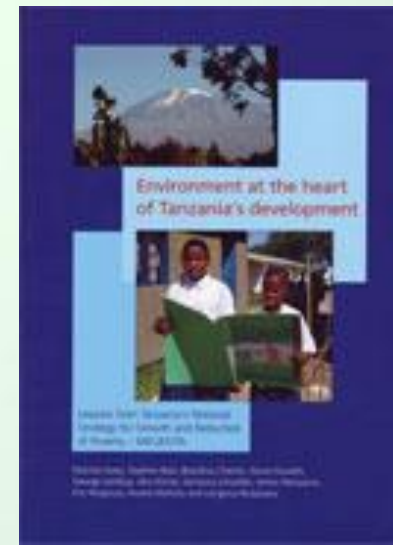
Env m/stream learning group in TZ: “What e/d outcomes; what helped?”

- **Central coordination** – pov and env in Vice-President’s Office
- **Outcome plans** – no ‘priority sectors’ but ‘who can contribute’?
 - Allows env authority and ENGOs to integrate into sector budgets
- **Min. Finance** – review public env spending; link PRS to budget
- **Consult poor people** – 168 villages nationwide
- **Monitoring** – link pov and env indicators in dev M&E, census

Zambia learning group:

- **Coordination:** donor coherence; env units in ministries
- **Education:** years of env education by NGOs
- **Key tools:** many years of EIA and now SEA...

5. What tools have helped 'env mainstreaming'?

INFORMATION

- **Economic & financial assessment**
 - green accounting, expenditure reviews
- **Impact assessment & strategic analysis**
 - EIA, SEA, SoE, Natural Step
- **Spatial assessment**
 - Land use planning, poverty mapping
- **Monitoring & evaluation**
 - Indicators, audits, SD reporting
- **Policy analysis**
 - Stakeholder/institutional mapping

DELIBERATIVE & ENGAGEMENT

- **Participation & citizens' action**
 - PLA, citizens' juries
- **Political analysis & action**
 - Coalition-forming, commissions
- **Conflict management**
 - Dispute resolution, arbitration

PLANNING & ORGANISING

- **Legal tools**
 - Public interest litigation, rights regime
- **Visioning**
 - Scenarios
- **Management planning & control**
 - QMS/EMS, ISO, risk assessments

6. Looking forward: IIED env mainstreaming strategy

1. **Sourcebook** on tools/tactics – joint with OECD, UNDP, UNEP
2. **Country e/d learning groups** – do more, link internationally and to aid system (PEP+)
3. **Country support service**: esp for Pub Env Exp Reviews, econ case-making, SEA
4. **ICT/comms solutions** – link env and dev info...
